1 NEU-AUGUSTUSBURG CASTLE

1694 the Neu-Augustusburg Castle was declared residency of the dukedom Saxony-Weissenfels. It is a milestone of the early baroque architecture in central Germany. The electoral line vanished in 1746. Nowadays the castle is home to a museum which informs visitors about the former dukedom. The shoe exhibition and Castle church are must-sees. The latter has been preserved and is one of the most beautiful churches in Saxony-Anhalt from the early baroque era.

2 HEINRICH-SCHÜTZ-HOUSE

The most important German composer of the 17th century, Heinrich Schütz, spent his later life in this magnificent Renaissance house. It is his only residential building which has remained originally preserved. Since 1985 the house has been a museum with exhibits such as historical musical instruments, sheet music and documents of the composer's life and work.

9 BISMARCK TOWER

The Bismarck Tower in Weissenfels is one out of 146 remaining Bismarck towers throughout entire Germany. It was built in 1907 and is located in the very centre of the Klemmbergpark. With a height of 22 meters the platform on top of the tower offers a great view of Weissenfels. During the soviet occupation of East-Germany the tower was named after scientist Kepler. In 1992 officials claimed to reintroduce the original name. Furthermore there are numerous sights which want do be explored such as Feldherrenbank, Schillerstein as well as a beautiful Plane tree avenue.

3 GUSTAV-ADOLF-MUSEUM

The Geleitshaus was built in 1552. Today the Renaissance edifice is home to the Gustav-Adolf-Museum presenting an exhibition of the Thirty Years War. When the Swedish monarch died in the Battle of Lützen in 1632, the autopsy of his body was performed in the Geleitshaus. On the wall in the room the autopsy took place there is a bloodstain. Rumours has it, it is the monarch's. Furthermore ten thousand tin figures were cast for a diorama displaying the Thirts Years War.

10 ALL-WEATHER TOBOGGAN RUN

The all-weather toboggan run is a familyfriendly location with a magnificent view of the Saale valley. The toboggan run is 800 m long and has an integrated time and speed measurement system. There are other attractions included such as the minigolf course with 18 lanes, archery and crossbow shooting, natural bowling, gallows bowling, tractor driving and night tobogganing. Implementation of children's birthday parties, corporate and family celebrations, class outings and large-scale events are also possible.

4 NOVALIS MEMORIAL

Friedrich von Hardenberg alias Novalis was a very important representative of the German Early Romantic Literature period. He lived and died in this building which was once used as the Board of Mines. Nowadays it is home to an exhibition on the poet's life and work. Novalis died at the age of 28. The pseudonym „Novalis“ means „order of virgin soil“. It was first used by himself in the novel „Blütenstaub“ in 1798. Enclosed to the building is a garden with a pavilion - a rather pleasant place to get away and relax. Novalis' grave is located nearby in the city park.



11 ZOOLOGICAL GARDEN

With a total area of 12.600 squaremeters the Zoological Garden is home to 100 animals in 50 different species. The interesting local flora is put on display in various herb and stone beds as well as wetlands and swamp beds. A special feature would be the path of the senses. Onlookers are to examine flora and fauna in a rather playful manner by listening, touching and observing nature. The garden is worth a visit in any season.

5 CHURCH OF ST. MARY

The church of St. Mary was consecrated in 1303. The three-aisled hall church – dating back to the late Gothic period – was extensively renovated and enlarged in the 15/16th century. The church tower was rebuilt in the baroque style after a devastating fire in 1718. Temporarily the church also functioned as a representative court church. The most important furnishings date back to this period. The organ was built in 1862/64 by the Weißenfels organ builder Friedrich Ladegast. This very organ was a prime example of his working skills.

12 FOUNTAIN OF THE CITY'S HISTORY

At the end of the 20th century the city history fountain was erected in the street Judenstraße. Heinrich Schütz and Johann Sebastian Bach are depicted as symbols of the musical tradition. With Thumbelina in a shoe and a seamstress the shoe industry in Weissenfels is represented.

6 MONASTERY ST. CLARA

The monastery of St. Clara was built and consecrated in 1301. In 1570 the last abbes of the convent died. Founded the Duke Augustus of Saxony-Weissenfels the „Gymnasium Illustre Augusteum“ was located in the building since 1664. Here the future officials of the country were educated. After the extinction of the duke line, from 1837 onwards, the building was first used to educate teachers, then as a municipal museum followed by a police station.

15 CITY PARK


Originally layed out as a shooting ditch, the City Park was used as cemetry since 1522. After two additional cemtries had been established, the original one was transformed into the City Park.

17 CITY HALL

The Renaissance City Hall which partially burnt was rebuilt by Christoph Schulze in 1720 using the remains of the building. Up the tower there are two clocks as well as an additional lunar clock. Two lions carrying the city arms announce the long term relation to the former Saxon ruling family Wettiner.

7 ROYAL HOUSE

Built in 1673 by Moritz Richter, the chief building constrcutor of the Neu-Augustus Castle, the Royal House was first used as a residency for important appointees of the court. This is what the name Royal House refers to. Nowadays it is home to a registry office. The clear-cut-design of the building displays elements of the baroque era. The nine-section ceiling in the ballroom was built around 1680 after the model of the Whitehall Palace in London.
